HORSES IN TRAFFIC ARE YOU AWARE?

180 horses and 36 riders too much have lost their lives - only because some car drivers were ignorant, absent, lazy, unaware or in a rush.

Over the last four years in UK there have been 2900 reported road accidents - caused by drivers' inattention - where horses and riders have been hurt. 1500 of those cases, which is nearly 3 in 4, are based on the fact that vehicles have passed too close.

oad accidents involving horget more and and cars the time. common all Every equestrian or horse driver can mention at least one time where they have been put in a scary or "close call"- situation. That needs to change immediately, everyone has a right to

feel safe and respected out on the roads. Horses are after all classified as a vehicle, and it does belong on the road just like a car or a bikes does. The only thing that you need to think about is to pay attention to the equipage if it asks you to slow down a little.

Section 215 of the Highway Code of UK sets out how road users should act when there's a horse on the road. Drivers should pass wide and slowly past a horse and always listen to a rider's request to slow down or stop. This is also something you learn at the driving school when you take a driving license - in every country.

The horse is a flight animal, just as the moose. If you compare those two, you see that they are very similar to each other. Their height and weight is the same depending to what kind of horse or moose it is, but above all - they are flight animals and will run if they get scared.

If there was a huge moose standing in the roadside, would you really pass it in 80 km/h? Why not? Because it can run out in front of your car? Many people think that the horses are controlled just because there is someone on their back, but they are wrong. If the horse feel like take off in gallop across the road, in front of the cars, it will.

That's why other road users have to slow down and give the horses space, because they get scared very easily and can jump out in front of other vehicles from nowhere. The car doesn't have to be what caused the panic, because it might as well be a noise, another animal, a mailbox or a plastic bag.

The most common things on the road to scare a horse are trucks, trailers and tractors because of their size, rattling sound and the wind after they have passed. Motorcycles and mopeds that sounds very loud can also be terrifying for a horse.

Normal bikes doesn't sound very much, and when they show up from behind it's shocking for the horse if it haven't heard or seen it yet. If you encounter a horse while driving one of these vehicles, be extra careful!

So - will you pass a horse as fast or close like you have before, or will you pay more attention and show more respect against the equipage?

If you won't, you always can worry about your car!

RECORD SHARK TURNED 392 YEARS OLD

The scientists thought that the Greenland Shark only could be half as old as it became

The Greenland Shark lives in the North Atlantic. It was known even before that these sharks could be over 200 years. Danish and British scientists report that it can become older than that.

After examining 28 females, they have concluded that the sharks on average were at least 272 years old. The two largest sharks were both about 5 meters long and 335 respective 392 years old.

The oldest shark swam around the Arctic Ocean even before the Battle of Lützen in 1632.

The age determination has been made using a new method. They usually analyze calcified tissue but it is very unusual for the Greenland Shark, so they were using the carbon-14 method and analyzed the eye lenses.

The Greenland Shark is the most northern shark and can live in zero degree or saltwater with a minus degree. Perhaps it contributes to their very slow growth, which is around 1 centimeter per year.

Since females reach maturity at a length of around 4 meters, it means that this occurs only at an average age of 156 years, reports the researchers. It's also a record.

The Greenland Shark is also known for several other peculiarities. It swims very slowly but can instead catch food by its eyes glowing green, which attracts prey. The green color comes from parasites that live on the eyes. It is a symbiosis where the shark is admittedly getting worse eyesight but help when it catches food. It also feeds on ambushing and catching sleeping seals.

In Sweden, the Greenland Shark can be observed in the Skagerrak and Kattegatt. So watch out if you swim in the north Atlantic, there may be a 392 old shark with luminous eyes swimming next to you!

THE PEREGRINE - FASTEST IN THE WORLD

The peregrine is a big, vigorous falcon with a black/grey and white coat. The upper side is dark while the bottom is light. The face mask is sharp and dark with a clear falcon mustache.

The peregrine has a body length of 34-58 cm, weight of 440-1500 g and a wingspan of 80-120 cm. The male falcon is visible smaller than the female, up to 30% and is about the size of a crow while the female almost is the same size as a raven.

This falcon is an aggressive aviator who hit its prey, which is about the size of a dove, in a nosedive over 200 km/h. The female often catch bigger preys because of her bigger size. They use their weight and speed to kill other birds in mid air by crashing them to death. A plunging peregrine can come up to a speed of 380 km/h or more, which makes it the world's fastest animal. Blackheaded gulls, pigeons, starlings and thrushes make up almost 75% of the prey.

The main threats to the peregrine are environmental toxins, biotope destruction of secondary nesting areas. such as miers which is threatened by peat mining, and disturbances. Despite this, the global population is very large and is not considered to be threatened, which is why it is categorized as viable thanks to the high numbers of individuals.

The biggest natural threats to nesting peregrines are fox, marten and eagle owl. Newly escaped cubs are sometimes taken by other larger birds of prey such as goshawks.

The peregrine nest on rocky ledges or on steep slopes. The slopes are preferably 10 to 100 meters high, and with some water below. The nest is often an abandoned nest of smaller golden eagles or bigger ravens.

MÖRRUM RIVER WATER COUNCIL — safeguarding our water

The Mörrum River Water Council area starts in Korsberga and ends down in Karlshamn and the basin has a width of 3369km². The water system is a home to plenty of living creatures like fish, crayfish, mussels and birds. The stream is over 183 km long and over 90% of the watercourses are in Kronoberg County. The overall goal is to increase the water status from 2015-2027 and to achieve good water status.

Next up is an interview with Nils Posse, who is Chairman of the organization (this interview is made in Swedish and translated)

I was wondering what it is exactly a water council does?

"A water council is an organization of interest for those who have interest in a specific water area or basin. This is also a support for water authorities to increase engagement and commitment to that specific water. Then it's up to us to create an engagement and to collect the knowledge and interest among the water. In a water council are all the included counties members. They have the interest in water, everything from recreation for their citizens to emissions and everyone who is risking to contaminate the water is in something called a recipient control.

You take samples continuously and look at if and how they are changing and how often. Then there are industries, campings, farmers, foresters. Everything living is affecting the water somehow, even those who live in the city, the second they flush the toilet. We have many members, municipalities, companies, private persons and other of interest. But generally water is our most important supply and without water there wouldn't be any life. And then there is so much roundabout. You are close to a lake here and the water in there continues to the River Mörrum. There is also a lot of growth, animals and bugs and everything, so yeah there is a lot that revolves around water."

How many members does the Mörrum River water council have?

"That was a really good question, I should know that. Maybe around 40-50?"

Which counties are members?

There are three counties that are in, Jönköping, with Vetlanda municipality, then there is Kronoberg with Uppvidinge, Växjö, Alvesta and Tingsryd municipalities, and then Blekinge with Olofström and Karlshamn municipalities.

How do you finance everything?

Partly with contribution from water authorities that stimulates and invokes interest around water subjects, but we also have a part time work that administrate and take care of the technical administration. But we do also split some work up considering the size of the subject

What is the most important thing vou do?

We take advantage of the interests, arrange expeditions and water hikes. We have annual meetings and place them in different ways in different places.

As said, we're an unpolitical organization and a referral instance, if there's any questions that concerns the water in our area, we have to answer.

There's a lot about the global warming and climate change right now, have you noticed any difference on the water in the last few years?

There have been very radical weather conditions and faster fluctuations. For example, it has been very, very dry for two summers, and very wet for a short time. If you would spread out the fluctuations it wouldn't be so much.

There was both flood and drought risk in almost the same year. That is what we see when it concerns the water.

How have the fishes in River Mörrum managed this?

The fishes are pretty good at coping. The biggest risk of death for the fishes is mainly if there is lack of oxygen. It can be after winters, when there is no circulation in the water. Also, if there are very dry summers when the water stands still. That leads to a rich algal bloom which causes fish death, but generally we have healthy water. Our goal is to have a good control of our water and good status on the water in our area.

What shines red around our area are the small lakes around Växjö. Partly because there is a very small flow and very bad circulation. A hot summer it evaporates more up in the air than it comes streaming, so there is no mix.



The heavily contaminated bottoms emit phosphorus, that is why Växjö municipality makes big actions trying to improve the quality of the water and the balance of fishes so there is enough of predator fishes and whitefish which is the predator's food. If there's too much of one, it will be wrong.

You lock the phosphorus on the bottom so it won't leak out in the water. That has been a significant difference. When I was younger you couldn't even see through the surface at all, and now we are talking about one meter transparency, so it have improved!

In Sweden, we are spoiled with healthy water for unlimited amounts, how do you look at the future and our access to healthy freshwater?

"Water, as I said earlier, is our absolute most important victual. We are spoiled and have much water, but we waste a lot of it, so all water we use is healthy, fresh drinking water. We do a lot of things and use water when we actually don't even need it - as when we wash our car and flush for example, so we are spoiled. The most important source for our drinking water is the groundwater. It doesn't come from River Mörrum, but from deeper down in the ground where it's naturally filtered, stored and purified.

In the past Växjö took its water from Helgasjön, but it's very exposed and partly they need much chemicals to

clean it and then the algae obstruct the pipes. Since a couple of years back we have the groundwater which comes from Bergaåsen, located oustide Ljungby municipality. It is of course not inexhaustible, but it is much needed before it's empty."

If there would be any problem with the groundwater, would it be possible to take water from the watercourses next to it? "Yes, of course it would be possible. If it wouldn't be possible to get hold of groundwater, which it always is, it would require pretty much chemicals."

"We are very lucky here in the North and we maybe need to start thinking over our behaviour and economize with the water. I think that we will have good access to water, anyway."



How much water am I using during a day? Is it really that much? Let's find out in this article.

MY USE OF WATER DURING A DAY

The first thing I do in the morning is to eat breakfast. I normally eat oatmeal for breakfast and for that I need 2 dl water. After I have eaten my oatmeal, I brush my teeth, flush the toilet and wash my hands. For that you need some water too.

Then I go to school and there I do not use a lot of water, I drink two glasses of water for lunch and that's it. But of course the school kitchen staff uses water when they cook the food for the students like me.

When I am home from school again I usually eat a snack and drink a glass of water, because i'm thirsty. Then I exercise and during my exercise session I normally drink a whole bottle of water.

I take a shower after the training and if you shower for 10 minutes you use about 75 litre of water. After that me and my family eat dinner and let's say we eat pasta, then you have to use some water to cook the pasta. After we have eaten up the food, the plates are dirty and we have to do the dishes. The easiest way to do that is to put the dirty things in the dishwasher, but you can also do it manually. You have to use water whatever you choose.

At the end of the day I put my clothes in the washing machine, you need 50 litre of water to do one laundry.

I use about 150 litre of water during a day and that is really much in my opinion.

I realize that I'm lucky to live in a country like Sweden where I have access to clean water every day.

OUR NEED OF WATER

It's one thing we all have in common, water. We all need water. All living things must have water to survive, whether they get it from a water fountain, a rain cloud, or a little bottle attached to the side of a hamster cage. Water makes up more than half of your body weight.

Your body can't survive without water for more than a few days, because it would stop working properly.

Water makes many of the many important jobs in your body. For instance, your blood, which contains a lot of water, carries oxygen to all the cells of your body.

Without oxygen, those tiny cells would die and your body would stop working.

Water is in lymph a fluid that is a part of your immune system and it also helps you to keep your temperature normal.

Your body doesn't get water only from drinking it. Any fluid you will contain water, but water and milk are the best choices.

Now you might wonder how much we need to drink. There is no magic amount of water that we need to drink everyday. It depends on your age, size, health and how much you exercise.

You usually drink when you're eating something, but it's also important to drink when you're sick, exercising or when it's hot outside.

It's also important when you drink. If you're going to sports practice, a game or just working out, you should drink before, during and after.

When your body doesn't have enough water, that's called being dehydrated. Dehydration can also keep you from being as fast and as sharp as you'd like to be. A bad case of dehydration can make you sick.

HE IS ONE OF THE WORLD'S MOST FAMOUS RAPPERS


he never got a letter back. Friends and family remember Eminem as a happy child, but "a bit of a loner" who was often bullied. Eminem started with rap when he was 8 years old and started performing at the age of 14. In 1995 he made his first official song and in 1996 he released his first album Infinite.

Infinite was his first independent album and was released on November 12. 1996. This album sold only about 1000 cassettes and 100 vinyl records and became, according to Eminem, a failure.

One year later he recorded his debut EP, the Slim Shady EP, which was released the same winter. Slim Shady is one of Eminem's alter-egos who represents his provocative and "evil" side. Slim Shady is the part of him that is giving back, is violent and says everything that comes into his mind. His character Slim Shady made him world famous overnight.

After that he just released more albums and he became more and more famous. In November 2002, he starred in the drama film 8 Mile playing a semi-fictionalized version of himself. The film won the Academy Award for Best Original Song for "Lose Yourself", making him the first hip hop artist to ever win the award.

With over 230 million records sold globally, Eminem is among the best-selling music artists of all time. He has had collaborations with artists like Dr. dre, Jay- Z, 2Pac, 50 Cent, Drake, Rihanna, Pink, Ed Sheeran and Beyonce.

"FIENDER ÄR TRÅKIGT" BY VERONICA MAGGIO

Veronica Maggio has now released her sixth album "Fiender är tråkigt". It is an album with a mix of new soft and slightly calmer tones. Of course, the album features not just soft songs, but also a bit happier songs like "Tillfälligheter", "Kurt Cobain" and as the title say, "Fiender är tråkigt"

Maggio's album is divided into 2 parts, the first part was released on July 14 and the second part was released on September 27.

The second part of the album begins with the already released single that shares names with the disc. The listener is welcomed with intense strings that guide you through the first track. A song about keeping together no matter what, and reunite in the good that was.

"Där hjärtat satt förut" is an emotionally heavy song about moving on but at the same time losing a part of yourself. The strange thing is that it is performed at a high tempo in the major. A soft sound made of organ tones and definite drums leads the listener to a steady pace for the short three minutes. It's definitely one of the stronger songs on this album.

The last three songs go into a much slower pace. "Rosa drinkar och champagne" leads the mood to sentimental nostalgic thoughts. The soundscape is similar to Little Jinder's sound, and in this case it becomes a pleasant counterpart to the opening songs.

"5 minuter" and "Vilken sekund som helst" Finishes the second part of "Fiender är tråkigt". Unfortunately, none of them really break through the barrier required for the songs to really fly. The lyrics have an emotional depth, but the music falls slightly flat.

Ella Harper was born January 5th in 1870 with a rare orthopedic condition. The condition caused her knees to bend the other way and she therefore chose to walk on all four, like a camel. Hence the name The Camel Girl.

When Ella was born she had a twin brother, named Edward, but he sadly passed away only three months old. Ella grew up and as a sixteen year old, 1886, she joined the circus. She called herself "The Camel Girl" and was often accompanied by an actual camel on stage while performing. Something that made her earn 200 dollars per week.

She later left the circus to pursue an education and says has moved in with her mother and a niece who lived in Tennessee and then disappeared from the public eye.

Ella then met a man named Robert who she married in 1905 and later moved with to Nashville. She got pregnant and gave birth to a girl in 1906 who got the name Mabel. Unfortunately the baby passed away later the same year. Ella's mischance continues when Robert and her, twelve years later (1918), adopt a baby girl named Jewel who also passes away only three months old.

Harper dies fifty-one years old in Nashville December 5th 1921 after battling with colon cancer, and is forever known as The Camel Girl.

So to say that they have it easy or have an easy work is not true. Cause they practise harder than any sport athlete and work longer than usual work days every day even weekends.

So why do people still don't think it's a real work? Because in reality it can and is one of the hardest works you can have.

BeamNG Drive

BeamNG.Drive is a car game with realism as the main point. BeamNG has got the most realistic driving and crash simulations of any game up to this date.

The game contains 4 campaign and 26 scenarios, and if you don't like the car in the scenarios you can play time trials where you get to change the vehicle, time of day and much more, it also includes a lot of tracks that aren't included as scenarios.

But scenarios aren't the point of this game, the main meat of this game is in the sandbox. In the sandbox, you can play on any of the 18 maps included with the game. And 25 cars maybe don't sound like much, but all of them have configs varying from the lowest with 5 configs (a threewheeled car) all the way up to the highest with 49 (a 90's American pickup truck). Most of the cars average around 17 configs. Also, the game gets regular updates like bug fixes and two major ones, every year, that can include a new map or a car, sometimes even both. And if you're not satisfied with any of the stock ones you can customize it, all from paint jobs to camber and rebound settings. If you're not already overwhelmed

with options there are mods. Just press the mods button in the menu, and go to the repository tab. As of me writing this now, there are about 3'000 mods on their website. Not counting automation built cars. You can also make your own mods, if you don't know how to get started you can always look at the wiki. Different mods have varying different complexity, the simplest thing to do is a skin, it's so simple that even I managed to do it.

No, actually the easiest mod to do, will cost you money, in the form of another game called "Automation". Since update 0.13 you can export your creations from Automation into BeamNG.Drive. They are not perfect by any means but when you get to design an engine, car and chassis you can't complain. Now it's just your imagination that sets the limits, and your pc.

Now for my complaints about this game, it's very CPU intensive. There's no multiplayer. Personally, for me it's ok that I can't play online with others, but you maybe want. Anyhow you can play locally if you have an extra controller, keyboard, steering wheel or mouse (yes you can play using a mouse, the tips during the loading


How did all start? Fortnite was launched in 2017 by Epic Games. The game exists in different versions: Battle Royale, Save the World and Creative.


CHRISTMAS IN USA

Bottom: 100a butter 2 digestive biscuits

Filling:

2 dl crushed candy canes 3 dl cream 1 teaspoon vanilla sugar 3 egg whites 3 yolks 2 dl sugar 200g philadelphia cheese

To the bottom:

Melt the butter in a saucepan and crush the biscuits into small crumbs in a bowl. Pour the butter into the bowl and stir into a crumbly mass. Put the mass in a mold.

To the filling:

Whip the cream and the vanilla sugar in one bowl, and the egg whites into a hard foam in another one. Crush the candy canes.

Whip the yolk, sugar and Philadelphia in a third big bowl. Turn the cream and egg whites into the batter, then add the crushed candy canes.

Pour the paste over the bottom and you're almost done.

Put the cake into the freezer for 5 hours.

Before serving your cheesecake, sprinkle grated white chocolate and some more crushed candy canes over the cake.

swedish "knäck"

Ingredients, 40 pieces: 1 ⅓ cups sugar 1 ⅓ cups light sirup 1 ⅓ cups heavy cream 1 tablespoon butter 3 tablespoons chopped sweet almond or candy cane

You'll also need "knäckformar"

To do before: Chop the almonds or candy cane before or while boiling the mix.


step 1. Mix sugar, sirup and heavy cream in a casserole and boil for 15 - 20 minutes.

step 2. To see if the batter is done boiling, pour some of it in a glass of cold water. If the batter doesn*t form a round ball, let it boil for a couple more minutes.

step 3. Move the casserole to the side and mix in butter and the chopped sweet almond. The almond is optional but it adds a nice taste to it. You can chop candy cane as well for a more minty taste.

step 4. Pour the batter in the tiny cupcake cups called "knäckformar". It's easiest to do so if you line them all up on a baking pan or plate before the batter is done boiling.

step 5. Let it cool.



FC Bayern München - best team in Germany

Bayern München is a German football team. They play in the highest division in Germany, which is called the Bundesliga.

Bayern München is the most successful club in Germany because they have won the league title 29 times and the German cup 19 times. No other German team has won as many trophies as Bayern München.

FC Bayern was founded in 1900 by Franz John and 32 years later, Bayern won their first Bundesliga trophy. The club had its period of greatest success in the midd le of the 1970s when it won the European Cup three times in a row (1974–1976). The star player back then was Franz Beckenbauer. The biggest rivals of Bayern München is Borussia Dortmund. The fans do not like each other and the atmosphere in the stadium is heated when Bayern play against Dortmund. Since the beginning of the 2005-06 season, Bayern has played its home games at the Allianz Arena. The Allianz Arena has a maximum capacity of 75.000 spectators. Only Dortmund has a bigger stadium with a maximum capacity of 80.000. Previously the team had played at Munich's Olympiastadion for 33 years.

The team colours are red and white, and the team crest shows the white and blue flag of Bavaria. Bavaria is the landscape in Munich.
